David Tonkonogui Memorial Award (DTMA) Junior Award

Music of Remembrance (MOR) is a performing arts organization focused on human rights and social justice. Founded in 1998, it has evolved from an initial focus on Holocaust remembrance to honoring the resilience of all people excluded or persecuted for their faith, ethnicity, gender or sexuality.

In 2005, MOR established the David Tonkonogui Memorial Award in memory of our beloved friend and inspiring colleague, cellist David Tonkonogui. Through this award, we nurture the education and development of young musicians.

In evaluating applicants for the Junior DTMA, MOR will consider each application holistically; the student's background and experiences will be considered along with their performance proficiency.

Eligibility: Students in middle school or high school at the time of their application, who reside in Washington State and who are studying an instrument, are eligible to apply for the Junior award.

Award: At the sole discretion of the selection committee, more than one recipient may be selected for the Junior DTMA. Award amounts will range from \$500-\$2,000 and may be used toward your music lessons or toward the fee for a music camp. The monetary award will be paid directly to your music teacher, music school, or music camp.

At the sole discretion of the selection committee, recipients of the DTMA may be invited to perform at an MOR concert in Benaroya Hall in Seattle.

Deadline: Applications are due **March 31, 2025.** Email your application and recommendations to <u>info@musicofremembrance.org</u>. The subject line of your email should say, "**DTMA Application**."
